## Proposal 1:

Introduction in the JJIF Organization and Sporting Code of online competitions as part of the JJIF tournaments (regulatory framework)

Background: Because of the Covid pandemic, in the past 18 months, physical competitions were almost impossible to organize. The JJIF, as other international federations, reacted to this situation, by creating and organizing online competitions for our athletes. However, because this type of tournament was not included in the official JJIF rules, several national sports authorities failed to recognize/support/allow participation of their athletes to these events.

Proposal text, to be introduced in the OSC, point 2, after the table, before 2.1: "Events may be organized in the traditional manner (with the physical presence of athletes, coaches, referees and other officials, at the designated time and place) or, exceptionally, as on-line events (exclusively for a particular discipline/category or as an additional event to events already organized for those categories/disciplines). The responsible authority for the event may modify the rules and regulations to the specifics of the on-line events."
