

FUNCTIONAL CLASSES

CLASS A

Amputated and bi-amputated lower limb (AMPUTATION BELOW KNEE)

CLASS B1

Total blind parathletes: from no perception in both eyes to the perception of light with inability to recognize the shape of a hand at any distance or direction.

CLASS B2

Parathletes who have the perception of figures, with the ability to recognize the shape of a hand up to the visual acuity of 2/60 or visual field less than five degrees.

CLASS B3

Parathletes who can define images. Visual acuity from 2/60 to 6/60 or visual field between five and 20 degrees and monoculars.

CLASS C

Amputated and proximal bi-amputated lower limb (AMPUTATION ABOVE KNEE)

CLASS D

Amputee and bi-amputated upper limb. (ARM AMPUTATION, BELOW THE ELBOW)

CLASS E

Amputated and proximal bi-amputated upper limb. (ARM AMPUTATION, ABOVE THE ELBOW)

CLASS F

Hearing impaired, total deafness, can only compete with parathletes of the same class. (No use of deafness device)

CLASS G

Brachial plexus, partial.

CLASS H

Total brachial plexus.

CLASS I

Sequelae of non-severe polio myelitis of the lower and upper limbs.

CLASS J

Sequelae of severe polio myelitis of the lower and upper limbs.

CLASS K1

Spinal cord injured L1 to L5

CLASS K2

Injured Medullary T8 to T12

CLASS K3

Injured Medullary T1 to T07

CLASS K4

Spinal Cord Injured C1 to C7

CLASS L

Stroke/stroke sequelae that have mobility of at least 2 limbs and can remain posturely upright in the sitting position without assistance.

CLASS M

Dwarfism

CLASS N

The others (includes parathletes with some motor impairment and who do not fit in the other groups). Subject to analysis by the National Department of Functional Classification of the FBJJJ.

CLASS 0

Intellectualists. (Regardless of the level or degree diagnosed).
